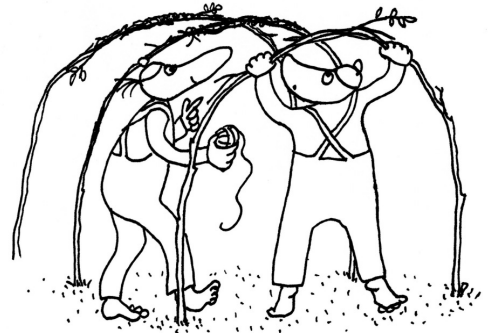
Who doesn't dream about his own secret hut?

In the hut building camp we build together 5 different hut, one each day. Building together is fun and the results can be seen immediately! The huts we build are real huts used by different

cultures around the world. By building huts you can learn about architecture in 1:1 scale and in a fun way!

In the hut building camps the participants are introduced to the history of movable huts around the world, the natural materials as well as the use and character of different materials. Participants learn different structural systems, joining methods and knots, to cook paint as well as dyeing cloth with natural colours.



By building constructions which have been developed by nomads over a period of hundreds of years one can get a deep understanding of the impact that climate, nature and lifestyle have on architecture. The life of the nomad required creative solutions for the building of dwellings due to the constant moving. The huts had to be easily assembled and disassembled, light to carry along or handy to construct all over again in a new resting spot. We can learn a lot from the simple and practical construction methods of the nomads.

Hut building camp is located by the sea in Ruukinranta, Espoo. The path to the forest begins from the address Gallen-Kallelan tie (road) 3.

Getting there:

by car: turn from Kehä 1 at the crossroads of Ruukinranta and go further towards Gallen-Kallela Museum until you see hut building camp signs.

By public transport: bus number 106 via Tapiola, 900 meters walking from Majurinkulma bus stop.

Bus number 212 along Turunväylä. 1,1 kilometers walking from Leppäsuo bus stop
Bus number 206 along Turunväylä. 1.3 kilometers walking from Laajalahdenristi bus stop.
By A or E train to Leppävaara station and from there by bus 23. 700 meters walking from Majurinkulma bus stop.

Hut camp start daily at 9 AM. and it ends at 4 PM.

The last day parents are welcome to join the ceremony where the children get their diplomas at 3 p.m.

During the day there is a warm meal at 11 AM and for snacks we serve bread, juice and water at 2 PM. We also bake thin pancakes with an iron griddle pan.

Good and comfortable working clothes are for example sweatsuit. Rubber boots are useful and rainwear is good to have too because building site is humid although it doesn't rain. Warm clothes are good because beside the sea the weather can be cold and windy especially in the mornings. Take Kela card with you.

By paying the hut camp fee until the date of expiry you make sure that you can participate the hut camp. After the date of expiry we give the unpaid hut camp places for those who are in queue. If you want to discuss about how to pay the participation fee you can call to our office phone 09-685 6426.

It is possible to switch the hut camp week to another if there are available places. If you get sick it is possible to get hut camp fee back by showing us the medical certificate.

Let us know all the food allergies and special diets as soon as possible. You can call to the office or send this information by e-mail if you haven't written these things to registration form at Arkki web page.
